**Squirrels** have had a very busy last half term. They all enjoyed taking part in sports weeks especially the ice cream van visit and winning the boccia tournament) and taking part in all the different activities for arts week. They have made tie dye t-shirts, pyramids out of lego and enjoyed a couple of walks to the park. In Maths they have been learning directions, which in pairs, they took part in a blind folded obstacle course!

This term **Endeavour** have been hiking around Dale Abbey and Risley for PE. We enjoyed getting exercise and spending time out in nature. In Science we have been learning about chemicals, identifying hazard symbols and learning about the meaning of some of these by, for example investigating which fluids may be flammable.



We have been practising our communication out in the community for English.

Endeavour enjoyed their trip to Crich Tram Village, taking advantage of the clear period to explore the woodland walk while enjoying the tram ride and exploring the museum area during the rain.

The children have been learning how to sit together, share picnic snacks and enjoy the outdoor experience! We've also been learning how to use ICT to communicate, and a highlight has been going to Hooks farm to order milkshakes.

Its been a great summer term, and we've also been doing some gardening in science, and weather in Art. It's been lots of fun.





**3F** have had a great term, they have really enjoyed performance, script-work and designing costumes for a production of the Gruffalo in English. They have also really

enjoyed looking at plants and photosynthesis in Science and we planted cress and have observed factors affecting its growth.

In Health and Independence, we have been focusing on independent cooking skills and keeping the kitchen clean. We looked at risks, kitchen safety and hygiene rules, then applied this knowledge when cooking.

3F have also gone on a residential trip to Hagg Farm with some students attending for the day and they have taken part in a number of exciting outdoor activities.

We are so proud of students in **Challenger** that have sat their GCSE exams. They have worked so hard and can now relax as this academic year is coming to an end. Our students enjoyed a trip to Castleton, climbing Mam Tor and a boat journey in Speedwell Cavern. In community and independence, we have planned outings, looking at routes and timings for various locations. These included Wollaton Hall and local amenities. Students took part in our sports week, showing courage and resilience in the events they entered. They then helped Tom and the primary students with timings, equipment and helping make it the success it was. Some of our students in Art and Creative practiced and performed on stage to an audience, showing great courage. We visited The Microscopic Art of Willard Wigan's exhibition at Wollaton Hall and even got to meet the him!! Each student in Challenger have individually made progress both academically, socially and should be proud of their individual achievements.

**Rabbits** have had a fantastic term and we have learnt so much! Rabbits went out for community lessons to the shops and by the end of the term they have become so independent when we go! The children were fantastic when we went to the cinema for our end of year treat!



We have had a sports day, learnt about plants and their lifecycles, even learnt about our own senses which involved us trying and making some very delicious food! We are so proud of our Rabbits, they have done amazing this term and hope they have a brilliant summer holiday, they definitely deserve it!



It has been a busy term for the students in **Atlantis.** Some have sat exams and all have been working towards completing coursework to use in future qualifications. We have also been working in the community carrying out litter picks in local parks, practicing map reading and independent travel training and also visiting a local care home to spend time and provide company for the elderly residents there. We have been learning about relationships in our health lessons and learning about discrimination and diversity as part of our preparing for adulthood curriculum. We've included a picture of our recent visit to Castleton in Derbyshire where students went down a

cave and travelled on a subterranean boat to a cavern with a bottomless lake and even took on the challenge of a walk to the top of Mam Tor in driving rain and winds. Their resilience and good humour was outstanding and while wet and buffeted all felt invigorated and enjoyed being in the clouds.



It's been a very busy year for all our students and we have two students leaving us this year to head off to college and the next stage of their journey. This term **Discovery** have been learning how to plan their own trips/visits as part of Community lessons. The students have used google maps to support finding the most suitable method of transport and plan a route to the final destination.

**3X** have had a fabulous summer term and have continued to work hard. There have been many things to celebrate throughout all their lessons, including a recent residential. 3X students who went to Hagg Farm from the  $17^{th}$ - $19^{th}$  July spent time taking on new challenges that pushed them out of their comfort zones and demonstrated how resilient they are. They went rock hopping, caving, den building, made a fire pit, along with the domestic chores of making their own beds and laying the tables. 3X have learned about Chinese music and graphic scores and have been composing their own music using tuned and un-tuned instruments.
