Have a peaceful holiday and we will see you all in 2021. Jamie Hutchinson. Headteacher



Squirrels have been working really hard this Autumn term. We settled back into our routines really quickly in September and it was great to have everyone back. One of the highlights was our Shakespeare Day and the students really enjoyed the stories - especially the more gruesome tragedies!

In **3F** we have been looking at staying safe in science and we took part in two exciting science experiments which we really enjoyed.

In English we have been looking at fiction and non-fiction stories. Our non-fiction story was 'All About Autumn'.

We went into our sensory garden and looked at the colours of the leaves and the acorns that the squirrels would be collecting for winter. Our fiction story is 'The Snowman' by Raymond Briggs. We are doing lots of sensory based activities to do with this such as finding the characters from the story in ice, making snowmen in shaving foam and making our own snowmen using stones and sticks that we found in the sensory garden.



Rabbits have had a great first term, welcoming new students and getting involved in lots of fun activities. We have really enjoyed learning basic cooking skills when making savoury and sweet treats such as strawberry tart and French bread pizza.



A highlight of the first term has been Shakespeare Day where we enjoyed reading and rhyming with the witches poem from Macbeth, we made hats and fizzy potions and dressed up to chant around the cauldron!

This term in **3X** we have been learning about English through media. We have been learning about adventure stories and what makes adventure stories exciting. Students have made up their own fantastic Neverlands and shared these with their peers.

This term **3S** have been working as a team in different subjects and have completed numerous projects including growing grass heads, making parachutes and devising advertising campaigns. 3S have also been learning about families. This half term in **30** we have been looking at advertising. We have




looked into where we find adverts; what adverts need to include and who different adverts are aimed at. We have watched, listened to and read a variety of different adverts, selling a variety of different products. We then used everything we have learnt to make, brand and advertise our own chocolate bars. We have designed packaging, made logos and even written

our own slogans and jingles. We have had great fun and cannot wait to pitch our chocolate bars to be the next best thing!

Group 2 have settled into the new year at Foxwood and are working well together. In English we have been working on autobiographies and on exploring narratives. We have been exploring the properties of 2D and 3D shapes in Maths and working on photosynthesis in Science.

The preparing for adulthood curriculum has offered opportunities to do hair and beauty, catering or gardening. In PSD students have been working on their emotional regulation and on their social understanding and interaction. They have been displaying positive character strength and being rewarded for doing so.



Group 1 In English we have been writing autobiographies and exploring narratives. We have been looking at shapes and lines of symmetry in Maths. Some of our students have been learning about photosynthesis in Science while other students have been concentrating on chemistry. We have been practising gymnastics in PE and they are looking forward to using some of these skills on the trampoline.

Group 1 had great fun researching school dinners at Foxwood, they did interviews and put it all together in a news film broadcast which they completed independently.

In Art we have been looking at buildings and cities. In Maths we have been learning about measure and using water to fill up different bottle capacities and estimating people's heights. In English we have been writing about Captain Tom's birthday. In Science we have been doing an experiment to see how mould grows. This term in Group 3 we have been working very hard. We have been working towards accreditations in most subjects. In art this has involved drawing fish using various mediums. In Maths we have focused on measuring and estimating- we had fun testing the capacity of different containers then making jelly! We have been writing about events in English and have practised hot-seating. We did role plays of a driving instructor with a student driver- maybe a glimpse towards the future? To keep active, we have been running, jumping and throwing in athletics. Science has been challenging this term but we now know a lot about photosynthesis and plants. We do different things in Employment- some of us go to college for hair and beauty; some of us cook delicious things in catering and some of us have been planting onions, crocuses and daffodils that we hope to see flowering in Spring. Then along with all that, we've had a few French lessons and have really improved our computer skills, especially in Excel.





This term in Group 5 we have all enjoyed learning some amazing things with Rob, Angie, Kerry and Jake. We have learnt how to be safe in our own homes by remembering to tidy up our bedroom and how to use different appliances in the kitchen. We have enjoyed listening to some different stories which include The Snail and the Whale and The Tin Forest.

Everyone has enjoyed Movement to Music on a Tuesday afternoon: listening to some great songs whilst moving around in the Sensory Studio. We are all looking forward to next term!
