Autumn term has been a very busy one for the Foxcubs! Our youngest pupils have coped remarkably well with the transition to full-time education and have settled into new class routines. In Rabbits' Class this past term we have been focusing on developing our handwriting and sentence composition in English, using adjectives and correct punctuation when writing about our Aliens. Our science topic this term has been animal habitats and plant growth. We've had lots of fun experimenting with plant growth and learning about animals and their characteristics. It was interesting to see the differences between our teeth and the teeth of animals, and how this shows others what our diet consists of.

Exploring our wider curriculum has led us to lots of fun and interesting activities. Rabbits' class produce some beautiful artwork when considering how colour use changes the mood of a piece. Many celebratory days have also occurred this past term, allowing us to celebrate different religions as part of interfaith week, which led us to make our own lanterns inspired by the festivals we discovered.



We have had a great first term in Squirrels! We have been learning about positive relationships and how we interact with those around us. Thinking carefully about emotions and how they may affect our interactions with others. We have had a great time horse riding each week and all of us have been working on our posture whilst on the horse and learning about the things that need to be done to care for a horse.
