Our topic in **Hedgehogs** this half term has been Toys. We have been printing with them, playing with them, singing lots of songs and reading stories about them. In Science we have been exploring Magnets and as part of this we tested which materials they stuck to! We also have been continuing to go to Tesco and trying to interact with the Tesco workers asking for their help to find our items

In **Rabbits** this term we have been exploring our topic of Toys in different ways. We started with a story about 'The Big Green Monster' which we practised telling together and then writing. This half term we have explored the story 'Dogger' and also learned about non-fiction books, getting really good at spotting them in the library and starting to spot some of the features. In Maths we have becoming 2D Shape experts, sorting and naming. We have been working really hard at our teamwork practising taking turns with games and then putting it into practice working together on our Christmas Fayre stall. Next term we plan to get out and about a lot more as we have been using our community sessions to practise so that we will be safe.

For the past few weeks in 30, we've enjoyed doing Christmas crafts and building our teamwork and employment skills. Having everyone's families and friends in school to see all our hard work was lovely. Our trip to London on the same week was also very exciting! Everyone represented the school beautifully and we had a great time watching the performers. The sets and costumes were spectacular.



Atlantis have enjoyed researching, planning and cooking/baking every Monday afternoon this half term for their Health lesson as



well as learning to use equipment safely and correctly. Students also learned new cooking skills such as slicing, dicing and chopping which they were able to do confidently. After a group discussion each week the class decided to cook or bake individual students' ideas. One experimental recipe was an ice cream pizza, which went down very well.

This term in **Discovery** we have been learning about the importance of exercise and how fun it can be. We played the rock paper scissors sports game, which everyone really enjoyed and have requested that we play again! In addition to this once a week we have been building up our stamina by trying to increase the number of laps of the senior playground we can do in 10 minutes! We have been so impressed with the determination and effort all students have put into this, the results have been incredible! Well-done Discovery!

In Enterprise we have been putting together our own production of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. The students have learnt the importance of storytelling and performance whilst also using their amazing singing voices to perform various songs! Each student has been brilliant at learning and performing their own individual lines and really giving 110% every time they practice. It has also helped students' confidence as they performed in front of their classmates and are given a lot of positive feedback!

In **Endeavour** we have been exploring force by comparing weights in using two pulleys. We have been attending the gym at Bramcote Leisure Centre and have really enjoyed it. The students have been engaging really well with the different equipment. We have also been visiting Rushcliffe Country Park and have become more comfortable accessing the facilities with greater independence.

In **Squirrels**, we have had a wonderful Autumn term. Everybody has excelled in horse riding. We learnt about Emmeline Pankhurst and the cause she supported and spent Employment working hard to raise lots of money. We raised a massive £145 for Macmillan Cancer Care and £212 making key rings for families to buy so that we can buy books for the new library that is being built. A very busy & exciting term. We ended our term with a Secret Santa and Christmas carvery, yum!
